A Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Alpine ISD was held on Wednesday, December 21, 2022, beginning at 5:30 PM in the Alpine ISD Administration Building, Board Room.

I. Call Meeting to Order

IV. Verification of Compliance with the Open Meetings Law. This is to verify that the provisions of Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.041 in connection with public posting of meeting notice was met on December 15, 2022, at 4:11 p.m.

VI. Public Hearing to Discuss Alpine ISD's Rating on Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) Report (Goal 2)

Board President Eddie Natera, adjuourned the regular meeting and called the Public Hearing to order at 5:31 p.m. to discuss Alpine ISD's rating on the Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas (FIRST) Report.

Clay Braden, CFO, reported on the 2020-2021 FIRST report, which is based on data from the 2019-2020 fiscal year. Mr. Braden reviewed the indicators and told board members that Alpine received an A – Superior Rating on the report.

This is on Phase I and Phase II, interiors only. A roofer has been secured and will begin working on a punchlist for the roof. Work is continuing on some of the on-going issues, with an anticipated completion date of late January for interior work. Mr. Braden and Mr. Vickers discussed other projects being addressed, specifically, some of the electronic issues. The walk-throughs will highlight other areas of need. Options for landscaping on the east side of the building were also discussed.

Dr. Rinehart congratulated the Elementary and Middle School campuses on their UIL wins, discussed mid-year assessments, and staff surveys. Additionally, she provided information on the Teacher Incentive Allotment system.

A. Enrollment Report

Dr. Rinehart reviewed enrollment numbers. The total enrollment for the district stands at 964, with 386 at the Elementary, 269 at the Middle School and 309 at the High School.

B. Safety and Security Updates

Reviewed current procedures and discussed recommendations for changes. Beginning January 1st, Alpine ISD will no longer required clear or mesh backpacks, and will no longer require locking on interior classroom doors.

C. Facilities Plan

Reviewed the new process for developing an extended plan. A team comprised of the Superintendent, Campus Principals, CFO, Maintenance director, Maintenance Assistant, and building custodians have been walking through each campus, consulting with teachers to document needs over the next five years, as well as short term needs and solutions.
